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
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

Map

Part 3 covers observations from September 1965 through June 1969, on Palaearctic migrants (presented without status subgroups) and species about which information from our area is insufficient to place them in a positive status group. A few of the species assigned to the Uncertain group when Parts 1 and 2 were completed are now better understood. These have been transferred to a special Appendix, where they are dealt with in Bannerman species order. Finally, the map of the observation area, which failed to print properly in Part 1, has been re-drawn.

View, however, was brief and in fading evening light. On 23.v.67 single birds were recorded independently near Tsulu rapids (FW) and Shagunu (DW). Features noted included pale underparts and, in the Shagunu sighting, dark monstachial stripes. Both birds were small and with relatively longer wings than other falcons known in the area. Another unidentified 'hobby' recorded 6.x.67. <u>Falco cuvieri</u> occurs in Borgu but the reddish underparts of this species are a conspicuous field character.
