## Errata

### Bird observations from Aouk, S Chad, including additions to the avifauna

In our article on observations from Aouk, southern Chad (2009, *Malimbus* 31: 57–60), two errors escaped our attention but not that of two readers, Claude Chappuis and Ron Demey. The Yellow-throated Bulbul *Chlorocichla flavigollis* is not new for the country list, as Chappuis (2000, *Oiseaux d'Afrique 2. West and Central Africa*. CD 9, band 64) presented a recording from Moundou; and the English name of *Hippolais opaca* is Western Olivaceous Warbler, not Eastern (which is *H. pallida*).
