Some important recent events: The Gambia Ornithological Society has been constituted and publishes an annual bird report (Secretary: P.O. Box 757, Banjul, The Gambia); in March 1977 the long-awaited 'A Field Guide to the Birds of West Africa' by W. Serle and G. J. Morel was published (Collins, London, £5.95). A review will appear in an early number of The Nigerian Field; and also in March the East African Natural History Society launched its new journal of ornithology, Scopus (see p. 84).
